Join us at our May 13<sup>th</sup> meeting, when our guest speaker will be Emy Mendoza, a Zero Waste Planner with the City of San Jose Environmental Services Department.

The City of San Jose, in collaboration with various other Santa Clara County cities, has participated in an effort led by the Santa Clara County Recycling and Waste Reduction Commission to encourage shopping with reusable bags, and reduce the use of disposable bags, regionally.

The City is considering a fee on plastic and paper bags to deal with plastic bag litter, which impacts neighborhoods, local creeks and streams. The speaker will present background information about the proposed fee and the potential impact of switching to reusable bags.
